Quick Tips

Protect your computer

Keep your stuff updated

Secure your networks

- Turn on your firewall. (Windows Ctrl Panel/Mac Sys Preferences)
- Install antivirus and anti-spyware software and set to automatically update. Examples: Avast, MalwareBytes, McAfee
- Set your system so that it automatically checks for, and installs, software updates for your OS and browsers.
- Check your security settings on your home wireless networks AND change the default passwords on you IOT devices (thermostats, security doorbells/cameras, refrigerators, smart devices like Alexa)

Quick Tips

Use reputable browsers
and search engines

- Use Edge, Firefox, or Chrome
- Duck-Duck-Go search engine
- Don't save passwords
- If you get a notification from your antivirus/malware program that a site you are trying to visit is unsafe, don't go there.
- If a site asks you to change your browser settings in order to "improve your experience," ignore the request and use a different website.

Quick Tips

- Don't share PII. Use encryption.
- Set up spam filters
- Don't save passwords
- Think twice before you open attachments or click links in e-mail.
- Use the Bcc line to protect people's privacy

Quick Tips

- use at least 8-10 characters
- include uppercase letters
- special characters (such as @ or :)
- and numbers

Use a phrase, incorporate shorthand, or use the site to give you clues:

- ✓ 2BorNot2B? (to be or not to be)
- ✓ It's@MyBank (it's at my bank)
- ✓ Matt6:9-13 (Biblical verse)
